Luke 22:47-53, February 4, 2018 Pastor Nick Neves

If Jesus was so famous, why did Judas have to identify Him to the guards with a greeting kiss?				
In the escalating tension of the moment, the disciples ask Jesus if it is time to strike out with the sword. Before He replies, one of them takes matters into his own hands.				
The 11 had not in preparation, and so they were not ready to react in a godly way. Peter strikes out in defense of Jesus.				
Jesus immediately commands them to stop, but he goes beyond this – Luke's gospel is the only one that records Jesus one of the very people who was there to apprehend Him.				
This healing is significant because:				
It displays Jesus' willingness to even those who would do Him harm.				
It the unlawful thing that Peter did, in a sense exonerating Peter and making it possible for Peter to not be captured and put under trial. (see John 17:12, 18:8-9)				
It demonstrates Jesus' to those who would soon misrepresent Him as a sinful rebel.				
Jesus protects Peter by healing Malchus, and reminds us that the Lord can what we mess up				
A final question to His captors reveals the wickedness of their intentions:				
"Have you come out as against a robber, with swords and clubs? 53 When I was with you day after day in the temple, you did not lay hands on me. But this is your hour, and the power of darkness."				
Jesus exposes their treachery, though ultimately their dark hearts are only helping the Lord's will be done. Their hour will not jeopardize His
