Luke 24:13-16

Two travelers on the Emmaus road are met by the risen Jesus, but they cannot recognize Him – His identity has supernaturally concealed from them. Is Jesus being _____ by hiding his true identity?

Luke 24:17-21

As Cleopas tells the story of Jesus' death to the third traveler, it reveals a problem with their _____. (see Luke 9:18-20)

Luke 24:22-27

At this point, Jesus openly _____ the downhearted disciples for the way they have ignored the Word of God.

These travelers are depressed, and there is a reason for it. We will become very vulnerable to disappointment when we choose to look at _____ of God's scripture, but not the _____.

Notice the emphasis on "all" in 24:25: *They were foolish not "to believe in all that the prophets have spoken."*

Notice the emphasis on "all" in 24:27: *"Beginning with Moses and all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures."*
