## The Curse of the Law Galatians 3:10-14 October 28, 2018 – Pastor Nick Neves

In Galatians 3:10-14, Paul presents a series of <u>four statements</u> that clarify the doctrine of justification by faith, and supports each statement with a scriptural proof.

Paul shows us here that a Christian must hold to what he *believes* based on what the scripture *declares*, not based on his opinion of what he would LIKE to be true.

1. All who rely on works of the law are under a \_\_\_\_\_

**Deuteronomy 27:26** – 'Cursed be anyone who does not confirm the words of this law by doing them.' And all the people shall say, 'Amen.'

2. No one will be \_\_\_\_\_ before God by the law

**Habakkuk 2:4** – Behold, his soul is puffed up; it is not upright within him, but the righteous shall live by his faith.

The end goal, according to Paul here, is that 'we might receive the promised Spirit through faith'. The gift of salvation is a blessing received, not a reward to be earned.

The law is not of \_\_\_\_\_

**Leviticus 18:5 –** You shall therefore keep my statutes and my rules; if a person does them, he shall live by them: I am the Lord.

4. \_\_\_\_\_ redeemed us from the law by becoming a curse for us.

**Deuteronomy 21:23** – <sup>22</sup> "And if a man has committed a crime punishable by death and he is put to death, and you hang him on a tree, <sup>23</sup> his body shall not remain all night on the tree, but you shall bury him the same day, for a hanged man is cursed by God. You shall not defile your land that the Lord your God is giving you for an inheritance.
