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Why is it significant that King Solomon is the author of this book?

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**Is Ecclesiastes a gloomy, skeptical commentary on the bleakness of human existence?**

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\*Ecclesiastes is only a hopeless and meaningless book IF the \_\_\_\_\_ that is exposed as vapor and vanity throughout its pages is the very place that you are looking to find your fulfillment.
