Ecclesiastes 6:7-9 – The Appetite of Man

Ecclesiastes 6:7-9 addresses man's appetite. Disciples of Jesus should have a great appetite for knowing God and drawing near to Him, but if our appetite for temporary things is allowed to dominate our time and attention, it may leave little energy for pursuing what is eternal.

God originally created man in a state of It wasn't until the serpent introduced envy and discontent into God's ideal garden that man began to be burdened by a perpetual, unfulfilled hunger. Sin has us to a state of want. (Genesis 3:17-19)
This idea of man's appetite is much bigger than simply a longing for <i>food</i> . What are some other desires that you have a great appetite for?
CAUTION: We live in a world where the APPETITE has been rebranded as This, this desire for more has often been lifted up as a universal virtue. What is wrong with that?
If we want Jesus is to be glorified in our lives, then our appetites must be put into check. One of the greatest gifts that God can give to believers through the book of Ecclesiastes is a greater understanding of our passions and appetites.
'You have made us for Yourself, and our heart is restless until it rests in You.' – A prayer from Augustine's Confessions.
This appetite that we must deal with can act as a <i>blessing</i> to us. It perpetually puts before us: 1. Our essential
2. Our essential to meet that need on our own.
3. The absolute necessity for to meet that need.
