- The church is established in late 49 to early 50 AD, shortly after the Jerusalem Council
- By God's grace, Paul spends about 18 months strengthening the believers there
- 1 Corinthians is written from Ephesus likely in early _____ AD.

Though Paul eventually moved on to new mission fields, his heart remained invested in the people of Corinth. 1 Corinthians is a letter within a series of correspondence between the Apostle and the members of that church.

*Of importance: 1 and 2 Corinthians do not comprise the total conversation.

- 1 Corinthians 5:9 there was a letter that we do not have that preceded 1 Corinthians.
- Paul had ministered to them at their start, but 2 Corinthians 12:14 and 13:1-2 reference a 3rd visit to them. That means a 2nd visit happened that is not recorded in Acts.
- 2 Corinthians 7:8 tells us that Paul sent a letter between 1 and 2 Corinthians... one he almost wished he could take back because it was quite harsh.
- So we don't have the whole story but we have the portions that God has determined will help us to know Him better and to learn how to guard ourselves from defilement.
