C.	<u>all</u> were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea (Paul draws parallels between the sacraments: baptism/communion)
d.	<u>all</u> ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink. (Exodus 16:2-4, 31, Exodus 15:24-25, Exodus 17:6)
